<p>Duties</p>	<p>Researches, compiles, analyzes and summarizes statistical and technical information in written, graphic and/or oral reports, and prepares and maintains financial spreadsheets;</p> <p>Represents StanCOG in statewide and regional transportation planning meetings;</p> <p>Conducts research and analysis regarding federal and state transportation funding legislation for use by management and staff, partner agencies, committees for a range of regional, transportation planning matters;</p> <p>Works cooperatively on assigned planning projects, plans and activities with established and specific operational priorities, and communicates status to management;</p> <p>Conducts grant research, writes grant proposals and assists partner agencies with the preparation, review and administration of grant and funding applications for transportation related projects;</p> <p>Plans, coordinates and facilitates a variety of policy and planning committee and public participation meetings to present information, to promote programs and services, to stimulate discussion and or facilitate consensus.</p>
<p>About StanCOG:</p>	<p>StanCOG is the federally-designated Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO), state-designated Regional Transportation Planning Agency (RTPA), and Local Transportation Authority (LTA) for the Stanislaus region of Northern California. StanCOG provides the forum that brings mayors, city council members and county supervisors together to work on regional transportation issues in a setting that promotes the involvement of the public in the planning and project delivery process. With the passage of the Measure L transportation sales tax in November 2016, StanCOG became a 'self-help county' and is focused on administering an approximately \$960 million program of projects for transportation needs over 25 years within Stanislaus County from 2017-2042.</p>
